
14. Given the length of time that has passed since the initial amendment request, it is appropriate for you to consider options to advance the amendment. Council's request for a meeting with adjoining parties is unlikely to result, on its own, in Council seeking to exhibit the amendment. Any issues could be considered as part of a future planning permit process. Adjoining land owners had their concerns heard through the C33 Panel process and DPCD is of the view that residential development of the site is not contested – merely the scale and design of development.
